

KICKSTART TO CAREER

Financial planning is a key component for anyone planning to continue their education. Our **KickStart to Career Program** aims to do just that by providing students with a child savings account along with financial planning lessons to help arm them with tools they will need to plan for their future.

Seed funding, thanks to the **John & Anita Wilson Family Fund**, of \$50 goes into each Kindergarten student's account with opportunities for match and incentive funds. Currently **over 1,200** Mason County kindergarten, first, second and third grade students have bank accounts to use toward career training helping build hope and opportunity for a bright future.

This summer, thanks to a grant from the **Patrick & Maria**O'Hare Fund and Robert R. & Joan Hasenbank Fund, third grade students will have the opportunity to earn incentive dollars for their accounts for completing a geography license plate search in Mason County.

CELEBRATING EDUCATION



WESTSHORE CTE & ME DAY

In an effort to begin career exploration earlier in students' education, local school districts, West Shore Education Service District, West Shore Community College and the Community Foundation along with many local businesses supported a CTE & Me event to introduce third grade students across our region to their Career Technical Education (CTE) and community college programs.

A grant from the **Greater Mason County Fund** helped provide the opportunity for students to learn about careers within six career zones including:

- Arts & Communication
- Health Sciences
- · Human Services
- Natural Resources & Agriscience
- Business, Management, Marketing & Technology
- Engineering/Manufacturing & Industrial Technology

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

The Community Foundation awarded scholarships to 67 Mason County students, including renewals, which represents commitments over the next four years of \$286,400. Adding to that support for students this year will be the Drs. Ruth and John Carney and Irene Carney Kendrick Memorial Scholarship.

Dr. John Carney was a fixture in the Ludington community for over 70 years. He and his wife, Dr. Ruth Carney met in medical school at the University of Michigan and married in 1944. After a few years working in Los Angeles and Ann Arbor, they finally settled in Ludington - the "city of their dreams."

The Carneys' love for this community ran deep. In a conversation early in their marriage, Ruth told John, "I'd rather live in Ludington than any place in the world," and he agreed. They bought a house, turned part of it into an office, and got right to work. Both later held positions in local hospitals before they started a family practice that would operate for the next 42 years.

Eleanor Anderson—a nurse and longtime colleague of the Carneys—experienced this firsthand. John encouraged her to go back to school to become a nurse practitioner and then offered her a job at the family practice. She worked alongside him until his retirement. "It was a real compliment that they wanted me to join their practice," said Eleanor. "Dr. Carney was a great teacher."

After a lifetime of community service, Ruth passed away in 2000. In the ensuing years, John married June Strahan, co-authored a book, and enjoyed time playing golf, racquetball, and bridge. He died in 2022 at the age of 100.

A gift made through his estate created **two funds** at the Community Foundation to carry on his family legacy and support local students. John's encouraging spirit lives on in the two funds he created.

DRS. RUTH & JOHN CARNEY & IRENE CARNEY KENDRICK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Drs. Ruth and John Carney and Irene Carney Kendrick Memorial Scholarship — established in memory of his first wife and their late daughter — creates opportunities for adult students, students pursuing postgraduate degrees, or those facing barriers to getting a college degree. The Drs. Ruth and John Carney Education Fund is a field-of-interest fund designed to address the diverse and changing educational needs in Mason County for generations to come.





CELEBRATING WORKFORCE SUPPORT

HOUSING NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Mason County lacks a county-wide perspective on housing development needs. With the convening of local leaders, we will invest in a **housing needs assessment**. This will provide data to prioritize residential development and ensure that everyone has safe, affordable housing.



UNITED WAY AUTO LOAN PROGRAM

A grant from the Greater Mason County Fund provided seed funding to United Way of Mason County to create a transportation loan fund available to employees of the **Lakeshore Employer Resource Network (LERN).**

Loans are available at **0% interest** with a reasonable payback schedule. This valuable resource has helped employees maintain their employment by removing transportation barriers.

RIDES TO WELLNESS

Transportation can be a barrier to health and wellness for many in our community. Grants from the Rick & Mary Ann Randall and Greater Mason County Funds provided seed funding to pilot the **Rides to Wellness Program.**

This program provides transportation, through **Ludington Mass Transit Authority (LMTA)**, for seniors and residents with disabilities to non-emergency medical appointments in Mason County. Rides-to-Wellness has provided services to seven townships including Hamlin, Amber, Branch, Freesoil, Riverton, Custer, and Victory.

Prior to the start of the program, transportation services would have been unavailable to residents in these areas. As of the end of 2022, there had been **334 trips** since the start of the program in April of 2022. We are so proud to partner with LMTA!

CELEBRATING RECREATION

HAMLIN BEACH ACCESSIBILITY

The beach walkway at Lake Michigan is heavily used by people of all abilities, just as the ones the City of Ludington has at Stearns Park. For some it is a matter of convenience, for others it's essential. Input from accessibility advocates Jamie Spore and Shelby Soberalski and a grant from Jeanne Oakes along with matching funds from the Michigan DNR made the addition of a walkway for use on the Ludington State Park's Hamlin Lake Beach as well as two new beach wheelchairs a reality.





YOUTH SAILING SCHOOL

The Ludington Youth Sailing School's mission is to introduce Mason County youths to the sport of sailing and promote comfort on the water. Grants from the Ludington Youth Recreation and Greater Mason County Fund supported improvements to the sailing instruction site to increase safety as well as instruction and practice time during each learning session. This year 157 sailors, up from 40 participants last year, learned about water safety, gained confidence and skill on the water and became acquainted with the Coast Guard and Mason County Sheriff's Department Marine Patrols.

AFTER-SCHOOL ART VENTURES

The Ludington Area Center for the Arts (LACA) strives to promote the arts within our community. This year grants from the Patrick & Maria O'Hare and Greater Mason County Funds supported afterschool youth art programming including a variety of themed workshops each week, snacks, and transportation from Ludington Elementary School.

Over **54 students** from schools across Mason County have taken advantage of this opportunity. In addition to feeding the creative spirit in area youth this program has served as a form of safe and affordable after-school care, which is needed in our community.

PERE MARQUETTE CONSERVATION PARK

Pere Marquette Charter Township acquired 290 acres along the Pere Marquette River and Lake Michigan with the vision of creating the Pere Marquette Conservation Park, a regional destination where natural resources are protected and the community can enjoy outdoor recreation. Phase I of this project is construction of a new Community Access Site at the mouth of the Pere Marquette River, providing boating and barrier free pedestrian fishing and wetlands observation access for area residents and visitors.

With the support of the Community
Foundation, Land Conservancy of West
Michigan, Dow, Inc., Pennies from Heaven
Foundation, and a gift from the Thomas
William Paine Charitable Fund, the Township
established the Pere Marquette Conservation
Park Development Fund to support this effort.

CELEBRATING OUR YOUTH

YOUTH ADVISORY COUNCIL

During their fall retreat at Grace Youth Adventure Camp, the Community Foundation's Youth Advisory Council (YAC) worked to address the three top concerns of area youths. Based on a county-wide survey of their peers, these areas included academic stress, mental health, and substance abuse.

The YAC decided to create a **public** service announcement focused on strategies for teen stress to share in our area schools, social media, and our local movie theater. Be on the lookout for their PSA this summer!

They also responded to the needs of their peers by recommending grants to Mason County Eastern School District to support an academic planning program with a focus on stress reduction and to West Shore Educational Service District for a Math & Mentors program to build a love of math through games, along with teacher mini-grants to create innovative learning experiences. Some examples include salmon in the classroom, STEM bins for cooperative learning, Michigan Fisheries and Design, book tasting event, and more.

They also award \$500 grants for the All Around Seniors in each school district to give to the nonprofit of their choice; a tradition started by Katie Biggs, 2015 Ludington All Around Senior.



The YAC recommends grants from the Mason County Youth Advisory Council Fund, which was started in 1996 when community foundations earned a matching grant from the W.K. Kellogg Foundation.
